



Praise for Those Who Excel in Administration: SROA Launches Awards to Recognize the Best of the Best

Maryland, March 1, 2011/SROA — The Society for Radiation Oncology Administrators (SROA) is recognizing administrators for their contributions to radiation oncology management through a new awards program.

The society has created a “Service Award” for the member considered to have contributed significantly to achieving the organization’s goals and objectives. “Contributions by this individual are above and beyond what is considered to be expected.”

Additionally, SROA will occasionally present an “Award of Excellence” as special recognition of radiation oncology administrators who have made “significant contributions to the profession and the society.” These contributions include a career-long commitment to SROA and participation in research, teaching, practice, service or leadership in the radiation oncology field.

Finally, SROA will recognize early career contributions of administrators in the field less than 10 years who demonstrate public service that advances the goals of SROA, innovative contributions to SROA programs and a commitment to the field and the organization.

“These awards recognize the commitment of members to an organization whose goals include patient care and the wise use of resources,” stated SROA President Giles Toole. “The three types of awards address individuals who have gone beyond the “call of duty” with the Service Award, the Award of Excellence recognizes individuals who have contributed over the long-term to the field of radiation oncology and we will also recognize individuals who have been in the field for a shorter period of time, yet who have made significant contributions to the field.”
